

## ABOUT OUR COLLEGE

V.O.Chidambaram Pillai Educational Society, formed under the able leadership of Kulapathi Shri. A.P.C.Veerabahu B.A., just 2 days before the independence on the 13<sup>th</sup> of August 1947, started V.O.Chidambaram College, the first Arts and Science College for Men in Thoothukudi in the year 1951 and our College of Education in 1955. V.O.C.College of Education was formally opened by the then Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Shri. K.Kamaraj on the 5<sup>th</sup> of July 1955.

The college was affiliated to the Madras University, when it commenced with a sanctioned strength of 60. It was steadily expanded till the strength rose to 140 in 1968. When the Madurai Kamaraj University was born on 5<sup>th</sup> August 1965, our college was made to change its affiliation to the new university. In 1966, the very next year, the college started offering M.Ed. course. The college was functioning under Manonmaniam Sundaranar University from 1990 to 2008.

The college has also been offering M.Phil. course in Education from 1986 onwards. The college was recognized as the approved Centre for Research from 1990 for doing Ph.D. in Education. The college has been brought under the newly started TamilNadu Teachers Education University from the year 2008-2009. The strength of the college has been raised to 200 as per the permission granted by NCTE for admitting 100 more students as an additional intake from the academic year 2008-2009. Now the sanctioned strength of B.Ed. Course of our college is 400, after introducing the two years programme. Subbiah Vidhyalayam Boys' Higher Secondary School has been our Model School since 1956. The Model School is now renamed as Bharathiyar Vidhyalayam Higher Secondary School. In 1962, the college hostel was constructed on the Palayamkottai Road, Thoothukudi. Recently a new Women's Hostel has been established inside the college campus. Our college is now functioning with B.Ed., M.Ed., M.Phil. and Ph.D., Courses.

Our college is recognized as one of the best study centres by IGNOU, New Delhi and offering CTE, CTPM, CIG and PGDHE. National Assessment and Accreditation Council re-accredited our

college in the academic year 2012 - 2013 and awarded “B” grade. Our college has celebrated its Golden Jubilee, Diamond Jubilee in the academic years 2005-2006, 2015-2016 respectively.

### **Emblem**



The emblem of our college has three images inscribed on a shield: a lotus, a swan and a ship. The lotus represents knowledge and wisdom as it emerges clean from murky water in the morning. The swan symbolizes love because of its long-lasting monogamous relationship. And the ship, representing VOC’s Swadeshi spirit, symbolizes virtue. Our emblem envisions education as a process of disseminating knowledge, in a spirit of love and virtue, for the development of the individual and the nation. Thus, the motto of our college – “Love, Knowledge and Virtue” (அன்பு, அறிவு, அறம்) – is enshrined in the emblem.

The song, “Jana-gana-mana”, composed originally in Bengali by Rabindranath Tagore, was adopted in its Hindi version by the Constituent Assembly as the National Anthem of India on January 24, 1950. It was first sung on December 27, 1911 at the Calcutta Session of the Indian National congress.

The following is Tagore’s English rendering of the anthem: “Thou art the ruler of the minds of all people, dispenser of India’s destiny. Thy name rouses the hearts of Punjab, Sind, Gujarat and Maratha, of the Dravida and Orissa and Bengali ; It echoes in the hills of the Vindyas and Himalayas, mingles in the music of Jamuna and Ganges and is chanted by the waves of the Indian Sea. They pray for thy blessings and sing thy praise. The saving of all people waits in thy hand, thou dispenser of India’s destiny. Victory, victory, victory to thee”.

“Bharatha is like the face beauteous of Earth clad in wavy seas; Deccan is her brow crescent-like on which the fragrant ‘Tilak’ plunging the world in joy, supreme reigns Goddess Tamil with renown spread far and wide. Praise unto You, Goddess Tamil, whose majestic youthfulness, inspires awe and ecstasy”.

## National Pledge

The National Pledge is our oath of allegiance to the Republic India. It is commonly recited by every Indian in unison at public events, especially in schools and colleges.

India is my country. All Indians are my brothers and sisters.

I love my country and I am proud of its rich and varied heritage.

I shall always strive to be worthy of it.

I shall give my parents, teachers and all elders respect and treat everyone with courtesy.

To my country and my people, I pledge my devotion. In their well-being and prosperity alone, lies my happiness.

Our college has been named after the great patriot and Tamil scholar V.O.Chidambaram. He was born on 5<sup>th</sup> September 1872 in Ottapidaram, then Tirunelveli district (now Thoothukudi district) of Tamil Nadu. He was the eldest son of lawyer Olaganathan Pillai and Paramayee Ammal. He studied Law in Thiruchirapalli and passed his Pleadership exam in 1894. He practised law in Thoothukudi.

In 1892, V.O.Chidambaram was influenced by Tilak and became his disciple. Along with Subramanya Siva and Subramanya Bharathi, he became a prominent spokesperson for the cause in Madras Presidency. In 1905, he entered politics, joining the Indian National Congress and taking a hardliner stance. He also presided at the Salem District Congress Session.

V.O.Chidambaram established many institutions like Swadeshi Prachar Sabha, Dharmasanga Nesavu Salai, National Godown, Madras Agro-Industrial Society Ltd., and Desabimana Sangam. In response to the British India Steam Navigation Company's trade monopoly, he started the Indian-owned Swadeshi Shipping Company in October 1906. He managed to secure sufficient funds to purchase the company's first ship, the S.S.Galia. Shortly afterwards he was able to acquire the S.S.Lavo from France. The ships commenced regular service between Thoothukudi and Colombo (Srilanka), against opposition from British traders and the Imperial Government.

On February 23, 1908, V.O.Chidambaram gave a speech at Thoothukudi, encouraging the workers at Coral Mill (now part of Madura Coats) to protest against their low wages and harsh working conditions. Four days later, the workers of the Coral Mill went on

strike. Chidambaram and Subramanya Siva led the strike. Their demands included incremental earnings, weekly holidays and other leave facilities. The strike was widely publicized and quickly gained popular support. After nine days, the management agreed to concede their demands. The outcome of the strike encouraged the workers who gained increased wages and better treatment. By 1908, V.O.Chidambaram's political involvement drew the attention of the British. On March 12, 1908, he along with Subramanya Siva was arrested because of his intention to speak at a rally celebrating the release of Bengali leader Bipin Chandra Pal. The arrest met with widespread protest. In Thirunelveli shops, schools strike was declared in Thoothukudi, which was the first political strike in India. Public meetings and processions were held, and four people were killed by the police.

Although his supporters were able to raise sufficient funds for bail, Chidambaram refused to leave the jail without the release of Subramanya Siva. He was sentenced to two life imprisonments (in effect 40 years) and confined in the Central Prison, Coimbatore on 7 July 1908. The judgement was widely condemned in the popular press. V.O.Chidambaram appealed in High Court, gaining a reduced punishment of 4 years imprisonment and 6 years in exile.

V.O.Chidambaram was interred in Coimbatore and Kannanoor jail. He was not treated as a political prisoner, nor was the sentence simple imprisonment. He was rather treated as a convict sentenced to life imprisonment and required to do hard labour which affected his health. He was finally released on December 12, 1912. To his dismay, the Swadeshi Steam Navigation Company had already been liquidated

in 1911, and the ships auctioned to their competitors. The company's first ship, the S.S. Gallio was sold to the British Shipping Company.

Upon his release V.O.Chidambaram was not permitted to return to Tirunelveli district. With his law license stripped from him, he moved to Chennai with his wife and two young sons. There he ran a provisions store and a kerosene store. In 1920, Chidambaram withdrew from the Indian National Congress. He focussed his efforts on establishing Labour Unions in Madras and writing.

He later moved to Coimbatore and worked as a bank manager. Dissatisfied with the income, he petitioned the court seeking permission to practise law again and was permitted. He then moved to Kovilpatti and practised as a lawyer. He rejoined the Congress party in 1927 and presided over the third political conference held at Salem.

In 1932 he moved to Thoothukudi, where he spent his time in writing and publishing Tamil books: *Meyyaram* in 1914, *Meyyarivu* in 1915, *Anthology* in 1915, *Thirukural* with literary notes of Manakudavar in 1917 and *Tolkappiam* with literary notes of Ilampooranar in 1928.

V.O.Chidambaram passed away on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 1936. Posthumously, he is known as "Kappalottiya Thamizhan" and "Chekkiluththa Chemmal". The Indian Posts and Telegraphs department of India issued a special postage stamp on 5<sup>th</sup> September 1972, on the occasion of his birth centenary.

## LIFELINE OF OUR FOUNDER

Kulapathy A.P.C.Veerabahu, our founder, was a multifaceted personality who left an impeccable and indelible mark in several fields including politics, education, public life, co-operatives and the Bhoodan Movement. He was a visionary who was also pragmatic, a rare blend of integrity and perseverance. The following timeline chronologically displays a list of Kulapathy's life events.

- 1933 – 1935 : Education at Loyola College, Madras.
- 1936 – 1941 : Late Mr.P.Kandasamy Pillai, Secretary, Town Congress Committee initiates Sri.A.P.C.V. into Congress activities at Tuticorin.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Feb, 1941 : Married Sow.Mahalaxmi Ammal, daughter of Sri.S.R.Velayutham Pillai of Tirunelveli.
- 1942 : Founder Secretary of Tuticorin Co-operative Stores.
- 1942 – 1946 : Entered business and established a branch at Colombo, Ceylon.

- 1942 – 1950 : Founder Secretary, Ceylon Exporters’ and Importers’ Chamber, Tuticorin.
- 1946 – 1951 : Was elected as President, District Congress Committee, Tirunelveli.
- 1947 : Founded V.O.Chidambaram Educational Society, Tuticorin.
- 1948-50, 57-69 : President, Indian Chamber of Commerce, Tuticorin.
- 1948 – 1950 : Member, Tuticorin Port Trust.
- 1948 – 1971 : President, Tirunelveli District Co-operative Stores and Marketing Society Ltd., Tuticorin.
- 1948 : Became a Director of the M.V.Chidambaram Steamship Company Ltd.
- 1949 : Founded the Tuticorin Co-operative House Building Society.
- 1949 : Founded Co-operative House Mortgage Bank
- 1951 : Established V.O.C.College.
- 1955 : Founded V.O.C.Teacher’s Training College, Tuticorin. (Now called V.O.C.College of Education).
- 1955 – 1982 : President, Chidambaram Educational Society, Tuticorin.
- 1956 – 1971 : Director, South India Bank Ltd., Tirunelveli.
- 1965 – 1971 : Chairman, South India Bank Ltd., Tirunelveli.
- 1957 – 1967 : Member, Madras Legislature for 2 terms.
- 1957 – 1962 : Member State Planning Board
- 1957 – 1967 : Member, Consultative Committee on Co-operation and Education.

- 1957 – 1967 : Member, Tamil Nadu Congress Working Committee.
- 1958 – 1964 : Member, Senate, University of Madras.
- 1959 – 1970 : Founder President, Elementary School Children Midday Meals and other Aids Association, Tuticorin.

# **GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT**

## **1) Identity Card :**

The identity card is meant for identifying bonafide students and is used for permitting the students to participate in various activities and programs of the college. Every student must wear the identity card as long as he/she is in the college campus. It must be produced by the student whenever required by a member of the teaching or non-teaching of the college. He/she must take proper care of it to avoid its misuse by other students and outsiders.

## **2) Dress Code :**

The student-teachers from V.O.C.College of Education are expected to adhere to dress code policies. They shall possess high professional standards of dressing. All students should wear clean and decent dress. They should come in uniform every Monday. On other days, boys shall wear full trousers and shirts (Half sleeve/Full Sleeve).

They should not wear shirts bearing pictures and printed matters. T-shirts, short tops and low waists dressing and casual/sportive jeans (Multi pockets with stripes in fading colour) are totally banned inside the campus. They shall avoid wearing studs, earrings and metal chains.

Girls shall wear saree neatly pinned. Girl students shall neatly comb and plait their hair.

### 3) **Attendance:**

As per the regulations of Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University, each candidate of the B.Ed. Degree Course must earn 85% of attendance. 10% of condonation of shortage (i.e.) 75% will be provided to appear for B.Ed. Degree Examination on valid reasons for all including women students, who are in the family way during the academic year. No condonation of shortage of attendance will be granted in the attendance of 16 weeks for teaching practice which is mandatory and if a student fails to complete teaching practice, the shortage of attendance must be compensated.

- i. Attendance is compulsory. Students will be permitted to appear for university examination only if they earn sufficient attendance in a semester.
- ii. Attendance will be taken at the beginning of every period. A student who is not in the class when the attendance is taken will be marked absent and will lose attendance for that session. The professor in the class will decide whether to give attendance for a late-coming student, after dealing with him/her in a fitting manner.
- iii. Students applying for leave should send their leave letters forwarded by the head of the department concerned. Students who apply for permission for one period should do so, in person to the concerned member of the staff.
- iv. Students who have been absent without leave letter for one hour/session/day or more should produce a valid explanation for their absence counter signed by their staff, parent or guardian so that the penalty clause may not be put into operation.

#### **4) Bio-Metric System Attendance :**

Student-Teachers, Teacher Educators and Teachers should give their attendance in time by imprinting thumb impression on the bio-metric machine at 9.15 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Half a day leave, request for late reporting and early pick up are not permitted for students.

#### **5) Payment of Fee :**

- i. Fees for each year shall be paid in one sum.
- ii. Special fees include expenses to be incurred for Library, Journal, Science, Games, Association, College Day, Arts & Crafts, Stationery, Calendar, Teaching Practice, Students Service Fund and World University Fund, Amenities.
- iii. If a student leaves the college during a semester, he/she shall pay all the unpaid fees for the year.
- iv. Fee once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.

#### **6) Good Manners and Behaviour:**

- i. Our college is one family devoted to learning
- ii. Students of the college should conform to the best traditions of Indian national life.
- iii. Students should avoid doing anything that may disturb the unity and harmony of the campus life. Our college is beyond all politics and stands for all communities. Students are forbidden from engaging in any kind of political or communal activities.
- iv. On meeting the Principal or a member of the staff, students should greet them.
- v. When a member of the staff enters the class all the students will stand up and keep standing till the member of the staff takes his/her seat or asks the students to be seated.
- vi. Loitering and making noise in the verandas, reading room and library are strictly forbidden.
- vii. Students should cooperate with the college administration in keeping the college campus clean and green. They should avoid writing on walls and floors, throwing scraps of paper in lecture halls, verandas or anywhere in the college campus. Any violation of this rule will be severely dealt with.

- viii. Inside the college campus, students should be neatly dressed in accordance with approved etiquettes.
- ix. No student is allowed to leave the classroom during working hours without the permission of the member of the staff concerned.
- x. No student shall play for an outside team without the prior permission of the Principal, in any official tournament or match where the college participates.
- xi. When attending a public meeting, students should be decently dressed. They should be respectful to their seniors and superiors, polite and courteous to all,
- xii. Every day will commence with a secular prayer broadcast from the college office. All the students, wherever they may be in the college campus, should stand up, remain silent and pay attention to it.
- xiii. Smoking and alcohol consumption is strictly forbidden within the premises of the college.

#### **7) Disciplinary Regulations by Tamil Nadu Government:**

The following revised rules, approved and published by the Government of Tamilnadu will be observed in V.O.C.College of Education, Thoothukudi.

- i. Students should abstain from active participation in party or communal politics.
- ii. Principal may frame and issue disciplinary rules of a permanent or temporary character regulating the conduct outside the school, college or hostel precincts of students on the rolls so far as such rules seem necessary to maintain the credit, usefulness and reputation of the school, college or hostel.

Principal shall have full power to inflict the following punishments in the interest of the students or the institution concerned, that is fine, loss of attendance, loss of term certificate, suspension or expulsion.

#### **8) Rules in Exam Halls:**

- i. Students should demonstrate utmost honesty and good behaviour during examinations. They should keep silence in the exam halls and cooperate to conduct examinations.

- ii. If a student is found talking or laughing in the exam hall, or trying to copy from his neighbour's script, he/she will be warned and if the invigilator thinks it fit, the student will be moved to a different seat.
- iii. If a student is found copying from some manuscript or printed sheet or from any other incriminating material, or in the examination, must produce a statement in writing about his/her case, and leave the hall
- iv. The concerned invigilator will seize the incriminating material, confiscate the hall ticket, identity card and answer script of the student and provide a statement in writing which will be forwarded by the Chief Superintendent to the Controller of Examinations.
- v. The student may be permitted to appear for the subsequent papers of the sitting conditionally. Later, the student will be asked to appear before the Appeals and Grievance Committee to decide the sanctions against him/her for malpractice. The sanction will vary according to the gravity of the fault.
- vi. Post examination discovery of malpractice will be referred to the Controller of Examinations by the examiner. The Controller will refer the matter to the Appeals and Grievance Committee for a decision.
- vii. If a student is found indulging in malpractice in any internal assessment tests he/she will be presented to the Principal. He/she will be awarded zero for that test. Serious action will be taken by the Principal if the student is caught again for malpractice.

## **9) Library Rules:**

- i. Strict silence should be maintained in the library. There should be no rush or overcrowding either in the library or near the book racks. Wherever there is a rush, queue system should be followed.
- ii. When entering the library, all the books and other belongings of the student-teachers should be left outside. A rough note book or pieces of paper may be allowed by the librarian as a special permission.

- iii. Reference books and current journals and a few selected text books are not to be taken out. They are available for reading only within the library.
- iv. Books which are in great demand will be issued in the order in which applications are received from them.
- v. Each student will be allowed to keep TWO BOOKS.
- vi. Books should be returned on or before the 7<sup>th</sup> day of issue. Specified book may be re-issued to the same student only if no one else has applied for it. Such re-issue will be made only on the production of the book.
- vii. If any book needed is kept beyond the 7<sup>th</sup> day, then it will be considered as a serious offence.
- viii. Books should not be sub lent. All transfers should be effected through the librarian and only on the physical production of the book in the library.
- ix. Books should be handled and treated with extreme care. On receiving books from the library, the books should be carefully examined for any damage or disfigurement and the same should be reported at once. If student-teachers fails to do so, he/she will be held responsible for any damage subsequently made.
- x. Lost and damaged books should be replaced by the student-teachers who borrowed them. If any loss or damage cannot be traced to particular person, all students of the year will be held responsible for such loss or damage caused during the year and it will be recovered from all the students.
- xi. For holidays and the intensive teaching practice period, following procedure will be followed for issue of Library books.
  - a) All Books taken before the holidays should be returned three days before the last working day.
  - b) Application for books for the holiday also may be submitted on the same day.
  - c) Two books are allowed to each student during holidays but books in great demand will be evenly distributed.

- d) Books will be issued a day prior to the holidays and all the books should be returned on the reopening day.
  - e) Books may also be exchanged during the holiday on specified days notified by the librarian.
- xii. At the beginning of the year, the Principal may select volunteers to assist the librarian in issuing and rearranging books and for the maintenance of order inside the library. It must be the endeavor of all students and especially the volunteer to safeguard both the library and the interest and general welfare of the students with regard to the library.

## **CURRICULUM OF PROGRAMMES**

The purpose of theory course is to enable the student-teachers to obtain sufficient knowledge, information and understanding of the basic concepts of education, psychology and the methods and techniques of teaching. The practical course aims at developing the various skills of teaching, testing, preparation of visual aids, etc.

This course is of two years' duration. Each student-teacher is expected to give his / her utmost co-operation in every endeavour of the college to achieve the objectives.

Every student-teacher is expected to keep these dogmas clearly in his / her mind for the pursuit of knowledge and skills. They should do their self-study with the objectives informed by the college and must go for a self-evaluation so as to know how far he/she has developed in his / her training period.

The teacher is ranked next to God. If the present day society does not seem to give that amount of respect to teachers, the fault often lies with lack of ideas and scholarship on the part of teachers themselves. It is the duty of each member of the profession to be worthy of it by his / her sense of duty to society.

Opportunities are provided by the college at every stage to develop the student-teachers' character through self-discipline, service and democratic practices. Student-teachers who are found incapable of

developing self-discipline, character and scholarship will be asked to withdraw from the course.

V.O.C.College of Education, which basks in the glory of 66 enlightening years is named after the great patriot, scholar and statesman V.O.Chidambaram Pillai. He insisted on the importance of molding the future citizens of India with the ideal qualities of study, simplicity, service and selfless sacrifice. The student-teachers are expected to follow his footsteps in this task. The institution aims at making them competent and skilled to compete in the sphere of education and employment. The primary aim of this institution is to give the student teachers an all-round formation in academic, social and civic values. The college motto embodies three great values namely Love, Knowledge and Righteousness. The student teachers are expected to grow and cherish in these values to achieve competence, strength of mind, good behaviour and appropriate sense of values.

## PRACTICAL WORK

This includes the teaching practices preliminary and intensive class room work, the preparation of teaching aids, the maintenance and the prompt submission of records. Lack of alertness, and irregularity undisciplined behaviour will automatically lead a student - teacher being assessed as poor. These acts will also involve penalties prescribed by the Principal.

The internet has become an integral part of every individual's life. In this digital era, basic computer skills are required for teacher for effective class room teaching. The institution has developed two well established computer laboratories and also expose prospective teachers to browse and use 'Online Educational Resources' for effective classroom teaching.

The institution offers **Certificate Course in "Innovative Teaching Techniques (ITT)"**. Through this course, hands on experience is provided to student-teachers in operating Smart Board, Over Head Projector, LCD Projector, Video Recording, preparation of Power Point Presentation, Animation, Skype calls, Video Conferencing, Blogging and developing Social Network etc...
