### **1. Students:**

According to the feedback on curriculum received from the B.Ed students during 2021-2022, strength of the syllabus was 51% Excellent, Content coverage in the syllabus was 52% Good, Managing difficulty level of the learner was 63% Good, Applicability of the syllabus in day to day life was 49% Good, Support to higher education and research was 52% Excellent, Satisfaction to industry relevance was 57% Good, Support to skill acquirement was 58% Excellent, Availability of learning resources was 50% Excellent, Knowledge gain in updated information was 57% Good and Support for placement and job opportunity was 55% Excellent.

### **2. Teachers:**
